The Museum of Florida Art's acquaintance with Clarence Van Duzer is an interesting story that started in 2002.

The large abstract sculpture that now stands in front of the Cultural Arts Center was slated for demolition by a closing mall. We are fortunate that our board members believed that the work was worth saving.

Through the tireless efforts of museum patrons Parke Teal, Lillis and Rich George, Chris Harris, Art and Tami Pittman, and other supporters this significant Clarence Van Duzer sculpture now stands outside the museum as a powerful element and addition to the permanent collection. In 2007, the work was finally erected.

Clarence Van Duzer has an international reputation in the sculpture world and in the 60's and 70's was a preferred artist by many architects to incorporate his large scale sculptures into plans for malls, airports, hospitals and businesses. He is professor emeritus for the Cleveland Art Institute, and a graduate of Harvard University.

One of the "Cleveland School" artists, Van Duzer's work can be found in and around many institutions such as the Cleveland International Airport where the monumental steel sculpture entitled "Global Flight and Celebration" is installed.

This exhibition overviews this artist's accomplishments in a variety of different media and consists of scale models, maquettes, drawings and paintings from a rich lifetime of creative endeavors. In mediums of oil paint and steel, his abstract subjects will hold your imagination through his unique use of shape, color, and texture.

## Stephen Danko

We are saddened to learn of the untimely passing of member, artist and friend Stephen Danko. Steve had been a professional artist for over twenty five years. His education includes a BA degree from University of Florida and a MFA in photography from Florida State University. Mr. Danko taught and gave workshops around the country, including Tyler School of Art, Chicago Art Institute, California State University – Fullerton and the University of California – Santa Barbara. Mr. Danko also worked in major museums and galleries. Over the years he collected photography, contemporary and folk art. He has had studios in Los Angeles, Philadelphia and Cologne, Germany. He participated in over fifty group and ten solo exhibitions, and was included in many public and private collections. Mr. Danko received a NEA Fellowship in photography and is in J. Greene's, "American Photography", Abrahams. N.Y, 1984. Since 1995, Stephen Danko maintained a studio in DeLand, working on a series based on Florida themes. An exhibition of his work will be on display at the Museum of Florida Art from August 15<sup>th</sup> to Oct 26<sup>th</sup> in the Chris Harris Permanent collection Gallery. His work can also be viewed at the Daytona Beach International Airport.

## It's a Dog's Life: Photographs by William Wegman Travels to Naples

It's a Dog's Life: Photographs by William Wegman from the Polaroid Collection will be on display at the Von Liebig Art Center in Naples, FL from July 12 to August 10, 2008. The traveling exhibition organized by the Museum of Art and features 29 of Wegman's Polaroid images.

The work of William Wegman has received international attention with his photographs, videos, paintings and drawings exhibited worldwide. Wegman has created film and video works for Saturday Night Live and Nickelodeon and his video segments for Sesame Street have appeared regularly since 1989.

Wegman's interest in areas beyond painting ultimately leading him to photography and to video. It was in Long Beach that he got his dog, Man Ray, with whom he began a long and fruitful collaboration. Man Ray, known in the art world and beyond for his endearing deadpan presence, became a central figure in Wegman's photographs and videotapes. In 1972, Wegman and Man Ray moved to New York and continued a collaboration that was to last for twelve years. A new dog, Fay Ray, came into Wegman's life in 1986 and soon thereafter another prolific collaboration began, marked by Wegman's extensive use of the Polaroid 20 x 24 camera.
